- Charter Schools: Publicly funded but independently run, with flexible curriculum options.
- Magnet Schools: Public schools with specialized programs (e.g., STEM, arts, international studies).

Check for:

- Test scores and ratings
- Family reviews
- School mission and curriculum focus

3 Visit or Virtually Tour Schools: Ask:

- How are behavioral issues handled?
- What student supports are available? **
- How is technology used in learning?
- What does a typical day look like?

Documents You May Need:

- Birth certificate & proof of age
- Proof of residency
- Immunization records
- Previous academic records \u220b
- Completed registration forms

Charter, private, & magnet schools may also require:

- Applications & interviews
- Deadlines & lotteries
- Tuition or fees

🧠 Pro Tips for a Smooth Transition

- Start early: Some deadlines are 6–12 months in advance 💆
- Create a checklist: Stay on top of documents & dates
- Talk with your child: Include them in tours & decisions
- Build routines now: Practice waking up, organizing supplies, packing lunch
