



School Enrollment Checklist

Traditional Schooling

Before enrolling your child in a new school, make sure you have the following essential documents ready. Keeping everything organized will make the process smoother and stress-free.

Proof of Address

Examples: Utility bill, lease agreement, mortgage statement, or official government correspondence.

Tip: Ensure the document shows your current address and is recent (within the last 2-3 months).

Child's Birth Certificate or Passport

A certified copy may be required.

Tip: Some schools may also request a copy of your child's Social Security card.

Immunization Records

Include all up-to-date vaccination forms or exemption documentation if applicable.

Tip: Check your state's specific requirements—some schools require additional immunizations.

• CDC School Immunization Requirements

Recent Report Cards or Transcripts

Especially important if transferring mid-year or from another district.

Tip: Include any standardized test results, honors, or awards that highlight your child's academic progress.

IEP or 504 Plan (if applicable)

Include current evaluations, plans, or recommendations.

Tip: Contact the school's Special Education Coordinator ahead of time to discuss accommodations and supports.

Additional Tips for a Smooth Enrollment

• Transferring Mid-Year?

Reach out to your local school district for guidance on timing, transfer paperwork, and enrollment windows.

Private or Charter Schools?

Be prepared for additional steps like entrance exams, essays, or interviews. Each school may have different deadlines—start the process early to avoid missing critical dates.

Organize Digitally & Physically

Keep both paper copies and scanned digital files in a secure folder. This makes it easier to submit documents quickly or reference them later.

Communicate Early

Ask questions about registration requirements, deadlines, and special programs. Building a relationship with the registrar or admissions office can help smooth any challenges.
